They would all divide us and sow discontent. But, You have overcome the world and You have given us the Spirit which is greater than all that comes against us...







EDEEMER

- If you would like to keep your children in the service, sit toward the front so that little ones have a better opportunity to see.
- Quietly explain the parts of the service and allow them to "help" by holding their own hymnal and bulletin, finding the hymns, following along with Scripture readings and other readings.
- We believe children should be thoroughly taught the meaning of the Sacrament of Holy Communion and should profess their love for Jesus before they are allowed to participate in receiving this Sacrament. If the congregation moves forward to receive the Sacrament, feel free to take them along for a "blessing" from the pastor.
- If you must leave the service with a noisy child, please come back. We understand your responsibility to take them out occasionally, but also to allow them the training that goes on as children sit and observe the Church at worship.
