

INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS


 Again, I think we first have to ask ourselves as a congregation, what are our gifts (graces from God) and how can we serve our brothers and sisters overseas?

 Buen Pastor has many mission churches that she supports and upholds. There will be opportunities to serve in the future.







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


BUILDING INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS PRESENCE

 Global south Christians believe that American Christians are very "libertine" with their church attendance. We need to learn from them! Furthermore, they have many first generation Christians. They are younger than us!






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GLOBAL CHURCH SERVING RPC/AMERICAN CHURCH


 Perhaps the best way to conceive of Christianity is as a global movement. So much of our lens is through the lens of America.

 Christianity has always been a global force. For example, it spread to Africa and Asia before Europe. Christianity is not synonymous with Western culture.

EXAMPLE: MT. LEBANON EPC

 The mission was built around reciprocity. Instead of MLEPC going to Africa every year, the churches rotated. One team from the United States one year and one team from Kenya to the United States the following year.
