## EL BUEN PASTOR AND CHURCH PLANTING

- El Buen Pastor is working towards planting five churches within five years. This is named "5 en 5".
- The are currently finishing up building a church within the Apodaca neighborhood.

## MAP OF CHURCH PLANTS

- Buen Pastor (mother church) hits a threshold of members (200-300) and then commissions a group to plant a church.
- They have planted churches in the neighborhoods of Apodaca and Juarez.
- Monterrey is roughly the size of Dallas, TX.

## CHURCH PLANTING IN NORTHERN MEXICO

- Originally, Mexico was divided between two denominations for missions.
- The Methodists planting churches north of Mexico City. And the Presbyterians planted churches south of Mexico City.
- · Now, that is null and void the Presbyterian church is pushing to plant more churches in northern Mexico.

- They have shifted back and forth between an established church and "replant".




## ABNER'S CHURCH

- This church plant is the next one that will have a building built. They have been moving around town renting many different spaces.



#### LUIS MIGUEL'S CHURCH

- We visited Luis Miguel's church in the Apodaca neighborhood.
- We were able to visit their church building which will be completed by January of 2020.
- He wanted to host the next theological education conference in their new church!

## PARTNERING WITH BUEN PASTOR IN THE FUTURE

- Pastor David would like to continue hosting teaching elders from the EPC to host conferences to train pastors, ruling elders, and laity.
- However, they would prefer more practical topics. This could be talked through in it's entirety in the future.
- EPC churches could also give monetary gifts towards church planting in Monterrey. For example, children spaces need updated for safer conditions.

## WHAT MISSION TEAM **LEARNED**

- Buen Pastor and the Mexican Presbyterian Church are holding onto their covenant children. This does not seem to be the case in the EPC across the board.
- They are unashamed about their confessional heritage. They utilize their catechism and the congregations know why they are Presbyterians.
- They have an overabundance of younger ministers. This is different within the EPC!
