



#### Pastoral Concerns


- ■I am trying to shepherd RPC into being a truly" confessional church."

- What replaced catechism? Being a good citizen. Think golden rule.



## Remixed Religion

- In a culture that prizes choice, we "pick and choose" orthodoxy, liturgical practices, and traditions. We then create a designer religion.
- This manifest itself in the Boomer/Silent generation with the rise of "non-denominational" Christianity and some of the liturgical renewal movements.
- The Generation X/Millennial now mix several different religions together.



# Remixed Religion


- Remixed religion is in the Bible. For example, the golden calf incident found Exodus 32.
- ■Israelites were mixing religions and are given Ten Commandments (Exodus 20) and entire book of Leviticus to be catechized to be a "kingdom of priests" (Exodus 19:6).
- Exile is the punishment that Israel receives for not fully embracing monotheism, I believe.

#### The Goal of Catechism

- We should all, ideally, being shedding our remixed religion and moving towards orthodoxy.
- ■But how do we learn orthodoxy? Through the great creeds, confessions, and catechisms of the church.
- Learning to "speak/think God" correctly is a life long mountain climb!



## **Catechism Definition**


- Oral instruction

# Introduction

- ■What if we have been catechized our entire lives?
- Examples: public school system (citizenship), corporate America (work, work, work), and places of exercise (health).
- We need to catechized by the gospel.



#### **Public School System**

- I would argue that we were all catechized if we went through the public school system.
- We spent more time, in many ways, in the public school system than with our parents!
- We recited a creed (pledge), we learned dogma (freedom), and we were catechized on how to be good citizens.

# **Corporate America**



- Corporate America has a vested interest in catechizing their workers.
- We are habituated to think that making money is the primary meaning in life. Promotions become our goal.
- Corporations or any work place quickly weed out individuals who they know will become loyal to their brand.



### Marketers

- What if marketers are actually catechesis instructors? Doesn't the word "brand" sound religious?
- We go through a catechism regiment. We might sign up for the brand's credit card, we receive mail or email reminding us about sales, and so forth.
- All of these tools are used by the marketers to try and attempt to attach our hearts to their products.
