Summary/Overview

c. 740s-680s BC	Isaiah 1–35 Warnings and promises of restoration
c. 715-700	Isaiah 36–39: Hezekiah: Salvation AND exile
605-587	(Babylonian invasion)
c. 540s	Isaiah 40–55 (links to 35 and 39) End of exile is coming soon! New Exodus! YHWH will do what he promised! Hopeful conclusion
539-с. 500	(Persian conquest; Cyrus decree; returnees; temple rebuilt)
c. 500-450	Isaiah 56–66 If the "New Exodus" meant only return from exile, it was disappointing. Thus, future deliverance is necessary (fully "eschatologized"). "Universalizing": deliverance is for all nations!

Isaiah 56-66

- 56:1–8 Foreigners and eunuchs can be part of YHWH's people by loyalty "holding fast to his covenant" and keeping Sabbaths "house of prayer for all the nations" (cf. Mk 11:17)
 - 56:9–59:8 Challenges about Israel's immoral life cf. 2 Chr 28, the Good Samarians! Eph 2:13, 17, peace to those who are far off and those who are near
- 59:9–15a Prayer for forgiveness and restoration
 - o 59:15b-21 Vision of Yahweh in judgment cf. Eph 6:10-20, Armor of God
- 60:1-62:12 Visions of Jerusalem restored cf. Matt 2:1-12; Luke 4:18-19
 - o 63:1-6 Vision of Yahweh in Judgment
- 63:7-64:12 Prayer for forgiveness and restoration Ezr 9; Neh 1; 9; Dan 9; Mark 5
 - 65:1-66:16 Challenges about Israel's life; inclusion of chosen Gentiles; NHNE cf. Mark 5 (Giffone & Wile 2023)
- 66:17–24 Foreigners become even Levites and priests before YHWH!

Resonances of Isaiah in the New Testament

- Isaiah: David-king (1–39), Servant (40–55), YHWH (56–66). Gospels: Jesus is fully human, fully YHWH
- Matthew: Jesus is Immanuel, the Son of David, Light to the Nations
- Mark: Jesus leads Isaiah's New Exodus (Watts 2000)
 - o Mark 1:10 Isa 64:1 (MT 63:19b)
 - o Mark 12:1 Isa 5:1-2
- Luke: Jesus is Consoler and Healer of Israel and the Nations. Lk 4:16-21 Isa 61:1-2
- Isa 6:9-10 cited in Mt 13:14-15; Mk 4:12; Lk 8:10; Jn 12:40; Acts 28:23-28; Rom 11:8
- Romans 9–11: Isaiah's light to the nations, YHWH's sovereignty
 - o Rom 9:27-29 Isa 10:22-23; Isa 1:9
 - o Rom 10:20-21 Isa 65:1-2
- 1 Cor 14:21–22 Isa 28:11 Tongues and judgment
- Ephesians: Peace to those far and near (2:17 Isa 57:19); armor of God (6:14–17 Isa 11:5; 59:17; 52:7)
- 1 Peter: be prepared to suffer like the Servant suffered
- Revelation: Holy is YHWH, worthy is the Lamb that was slain (Rev 4:8 Isa 6:2)! Fallen is Babylon (14:8; 18:2 Isa 21:9)
