Gone Fishin'

"I'm going out to fish," Peter told them, and they said, "We'll go with you." John 21:3

I am sure that on Easter morning, in some manner, we all proclaimed "He has risen, he has risen indeed. And as we should be, we were encouraged and celebrated our risen Lord. For the disciple's things were a little different. On Easter morning and during the days that followed the disciples witnessed the risen Jesus. They saw and talked with Him but things were still not on a good path. They were still struggling with how life was going to move forward. **Especially Peter** who had in his memory the denial that he knew Jesus and was one of His close followers. As the disciples were still together Peter announced, "I'm going out to fish" and the other disciples said, "We'll go with you." And so, they left for a fishing trip. A time to go back to what they knew. A time to just do something! Little did they know that a miracle was waiting for them. As they fished all night, they caught nothing. Sound familiar?
