Adult Christian Education Class

On May 25, June 1, 8, 22 and 29, 2025, we invite all adults to join us on Sunday mornings at 9:45 in the Christ Center for our Adult Christian Education class led by Rev. Benjamin D. Giffone, PhD, and entitled: “Choose Life: The Book of Deuteronomy.”

Pastor Benj keeps insisting that the Book of Deuteronomy is the most important Book in the Bible. Given that Jesus quotes from the Book of Deuteronomy three times to the devil, it appears that our Lord Himself regards it as rather crucial content. In the New Testament, the Book of Deuteronomy is also the third-most-frequently used Book of the Old Testament. But, the Book of Deuteronomy also contains some of the strangest and most foreign material in the Old Testament. What are we to make of it?

This class will explore the historical context, structure, and theology of the Book of Deuteronomy, which is a pivotal point in the Old Testament narrative. What does this Book tell us about Jesus Christ, and our identity and mission as his people? Join us, in the Christ Center, at 9:45 a.m. each Sunday.
