Distribution of the Cup: The blood of Christ, shed for you.

As you pass the cup, please say to the next person: "The blood of Christ, shed for you."

Upon receipt of the cup, please hold it until all have been served, so that we can partake of the cup together, as a sign of our oneness in Christ and membership in His corporate body—the Christian Church.

Monthly Prayer Focus for August

During August, we resectfully ask that you focus your prayers on unchurched people. More specifically, choose one person (family or friend) and pray for that person every day for the entire month. Please pray earnestly for:

- The Holy Spirit to cause a change in his or her heart and make that one receptive to faith in Jesus Christ.
- Someone to enter the person's life and explain the gospel to him or her in a way that is compelling and irresistible.
- God to give you an opportunity to connect with that person yourself.

When you do connect, be courageous in your statement of why faith in Christ is an important part of your life. Mention that, recently, you have been praying for him or her every day. While you are with the person, ask if you can pray with that one right there. Then, ask if you can explain the Gospel. If this person has accepted Christ as his or her Lord and Savior, rejoice and celebrate. Maybe you can make plans to attend a worship service together. If that one has not accepted Christ, pray that the Holy Spirit will create a movement in his or her heart.
