Monthly Prayer Focus for August

While you are with the person, ask if you can pray with that one right there. Then, ask if you can explain the Gospel. If this person has accepted Christ as his or her Lord and Savior, rejoice and celebrate. Maybe you can make plans to attend a worship service together. If that one has not accepted Christ, pray that the Holy Spirit will create a movement in his or her heart.
